The Board Development Committee (Committee) of The North Carolina Partnership for Children Inc. (NCPC) Board of Directors (Board) met on August 5, 2024 via video conference. Quorum was not established. No action was taken.

### Committee Meeting Dates FY 2024-25

This Committee meets four times a year, approximately 1 month prior to the NCPC Board meeting, on the first Monday of the month at 9 a.m. An email will be sent to all members asking for their availability. Then the meetings will be set.

### **Board Annual Meeting and Retreat**

Based on the discussions at both the Board Development and Executive Committee meetings in the past few months, the board chair and NCPC staff have continued to develop the plan for the annual Board Retreat on Monday, September 16 from 12 p.m. – 4:30 p.m. at the <a href="Hampton Inn Midtown Raleigh">Hampton Inn Midtown Raleigh</a> followed by a reception at Amy Cubbage's house at 5:15 p.m. The Board annual meeting is scheduled for the following day on Tuesday, Sept. 17 from 10 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Dan Gerlach will facilitate the discussion at the Board Retreat. The focus will be on these objectives:

- 1. Strengthen relationships and communication within the Board.
- 2. Understand the value of Smart Start to businesses, employers, and state-level partner organizations in North Carolina.
- 3. Elevate the collaboration with state-level partner organizations.
- 4. Develop strategies and messaging for effective bipartisan advocacy for increased public and private funding.
- 5. Commit to supporting Smart Start's mission and initiatives.

The retreat will begin with lunch and a guest speaker from the business community, followed by discussion of ways to expand awareness and engagement with the business community through Board support. Strategic partners will share their perspectives, as well as the Smart Start Advocates' lobbyists, ending with a discussion of the upcoming legislative long session, and the role NCPC can play in leading for more investments in early childhood.

### **Board Member Term Dates 2025**

The NCPC bylaws include statements encouraging a diverse and inclusive Board as well as term limits based on participation and leadership.

In 2025 fifteen board member terms will end. Several of these may be reappointed. The Governor's twelve appointments will have a start date of Oct. 31, 2025. The legislative appointments will be made on the Appointments Bill during the 2025 session for start dates of Jan. 1, 2026.
